- Sawn timber for furniture, flooring, decking, construction
- Engineered wood for construction
- Wood chips
- Poles
- Lignin
- Xylitol

We even use by-products and waste products from our processes as fuel, or convert them into bio-chemicals.

YES, you can recycle these:

- Cardboard boxes of any kind - dry food, cosmetic and medicine boxes; roll cores, packing cartons (flattened)
- Food and beverage cartons
- Paper cups
- Newspapers, magazines and brochures, including glossy varieties
- Office paper, envelopes
- Old telephone directories
- Paper giftwrap (sticky tape removed)
- Hardcover and paperback books

NO, don't recycle these:

- X Food waste
- X Wet/dirty paper and cardboard
- X Sticky notes
- Used paper plates, disposable nappies, tissues and toilet paper
- Wax-coated boxes
- Foil gift wrapping, carbon copy paper and laminated office paper

Currently not recycled in SA but research is ongoing:

- X Cement bags
- X Frozen food packaging
- X Potato bags
